RETURNING TO CELEBRATING MASS TOGETHER

HM Government have indicated that the public celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass may recommence from 4 July 2020, subject to ensuring that important precautions can be observed and followed.

We look forward to welcoming you all back to celebrating Mass with us from next weekend. There will be many things to think about as we emerge, but next Sunday we will celebrate Mass in public at the following times:

Saturday 6:10pm Vigil, 8am, 10:30am, 12:05pm (Dominican Rite, in Latin), 7pm.

There will be an upper limit of how many people can attend Mass safely. Please email leicester.admin@english.op.org to get your name(s) on the list. We welcome family groups/ households to attend as a block, and aside from this, we will be caused to limit numbers outside of those who do not apply to attend. We should be able to accommodate a good deal of people at these Masses

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK AND DYING

This has been an important part of our ministry during the lockdown. The Dominican Fathers continue to offer pastoral care of the dying, and chaplaincy support to the LRI and other hospitals, in collaboration with the arrangements made by the University Hospitals of Leicester (UHL) NHS Trust.
